Ceremonial objects without any interpretation or comments.


Interpretation of Judaica

Audio-guide system

 Offers several ways of interpretation to 41 objects exhibited (comments to the objects)

- Suggests routes, for example:
- path of Hungarian Jewish history
- path of Jewish festivals
- path of Jewish iconography etc.





Exhibition on the 3rd floor of the Goldmark House






Garden of the Heroes
